# 1. 85<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Vimy Ridge - April 9<sup>th</sup>

The chairman advised that April 9<sup>th</sup>, had been the 85<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Battle of Vimy Ridge. By its name, Edmonton Public Schools' L'Académie Vimy Ridge Academy acknowledges the Battle of Vimy Ridge and honours all those Canadians who made such great sacrifices so long ago for Canada and its future. With its emphasis on Canada, L'Académie Vimy Ridge Academy focuses on building strong Canadian citizens who honour their past and desire to build a strong nation for tomorrow.

This year, the anniversary of the Battle of Vimy Ridge reminds us of the men and women of the Edmonton Garrison currently overseas. Our thoughts and prayers (best wishes) are with them and their families.

#### 2. Earth Day

The chairman advised that Monday, April 22, 2001 is International Earth Day. Many district students will be involved in activities recognizing Earth Day and Week – everything ranging from eco-tours, Earth Day assemblies, waste reduction projects, planting trees and gardens — to pitch-in and clean-up drives. Several years ago, the board identified Earth Day and Week as an initiative to promote within the district. The board encourages schools to participate. While Earth Day and Week only come around once a year, taking pride in our school grounds and keeping our communities beautiful and litter-free is a worthy cause for all — everyday of the year.

# 3. <u>April 28<sup>th</sup> is The National Day Of Mourning For Workers Injured Or Killed At The Workplace</u>

The chairman advised that, on average, over a million cases of occupational injuries have been reported by Worker's Compensation Boards across Canada for each of the last 10 years. There are at least 1,000 occupational deaths reported each year. It is these types of statistics that prompted the Canadian Labour Congress to set aside April 28 each year as a Day of Mourning for victims of workplace accidents and disease.

In recognition of the men and women of our province and of the district who are part of those statistics, on April 27 1998, the Edmonton Public School Board proclaimed every April 28th as an annual 'Day of Mourning' in recognition of workers killed, injured or disabled on the job.

The board encourages each and everyone to do their part to ensure that Edmonton Public Schools' work and learning environments are as healthy and safe for staff, students and community as possible.

The chairman announced that 26 Edmonton Public Schools teachers have been selected as finalists for the 14<sup>th</sup> Annual Excellence in Teaching Awards. These teachers were chosen from 82 nominees by a selection committee of representatives from stakeholder groups and education partners in the learning community.
