<u>The chairman</u> noted that there had been article in the <u>Edmonton Journal</u> regarding Edmonton-based environmentalist, Brian Staszenski, who has been named a <u>Time Magazine</u> "Hero of the Planet. Mr. Stazenski is the founder and program co-ordinator of Destination Conservation which has directed environmental retrofits at some 2,700 schools across Canada. The program started in Edmonton in 1987 and has now spread across North America, with pilot programs beginning in a number of U.S. states. In Alberta, the program is funded by corporations through a revolving fund. Trustees may recall the retrofit approved by board for W.P. Wagner. The energy savings from the retrofit is being used to pay for the retrofit.
