C. Communications from the Board Chairman

- 1. The chairman noted that MLA Bob Maskell was present in the audience.
- 2. The chairman advised that, later in the evening, the board would be honouring the Excellence in Teaching award nominees.
- 3. The chairman noted that there has been a tremendous outpouring of support for the families of the four members of the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry who were killed in Afghanistan. This has reached close to home for many of our students and families and our thoughts and sincere sympathies are with them and with the men and women of the Edmonton Garrison still overseas.
- 4. The chairman advised that the board would also like to express its sympathy for the students and families affected by the recent school tragedy in Erfurt, Germany.
- 5. The chairman noted that this week is Education Week. This year's theme is "Reaching New Heights". Education is the key to discovering new possibilities and indeed reaching new heights. It builds individual knowledge and skills, encourages innovation and creativity, and contributes to economic growth and strong communities. Teachers use their creativity and experience to produce activities, learning and great ideas, and innovative approaches to learning for students throughout the district.  - 1. Trustee Bonko requested that a report be prepared for conference committee with respect to the criteria or regulations pertaining to the random selection process in oversubscribed schools.
 - 2. Trustee Martin referred to recent media reports regarding citizenship studies and polls where 60% of the respondents did not know the names of Canadian Prime Ministers and in another poll fewer than half the respondents could not correctly identify the Canadian Alliance party as being left or right of the NDP. He also noted that a poll statistic indicated that 7 out of 10 people believe politicians are corrupt. He has found that many young people are taking pride in the fact that they are not voting.

Trustee Martin requested that information be provided on how the social studies curriculum, especially at the high school level, addresses the topic of citizenship.
