#### **ISSUE**

JA.BP Parent and Community Involvement (Attachment I), has been reviewed and revisions are being proposed.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

- 1. That revised policy JA.BP Parent and Community Involvement be considered for the first time.
- 2. That revised policy JA.BP Parent and Community Involvement be considered for the second time.

# **BACKGROUND**

The Administration has revised the policy to strengthen the role of school councils. The section on community groups seeking the Board's endorsement of initiatives that support teaching and learning was moved to a separate policy JAC.BP – Funding and Endorsement Requests from External Organizations (Proposed). The proposed revision to policy JA.BP Parent and Community Involvement reflects feedback received from stakeholders via an online survey. The survey was available on the district website from January 25 to February 22, 2012.

#### **RELATED FACTS**

- A total of 42 people participated in the online survey on JA.BP Parent and Community Involvement (15 parents, four community members, seven principals/decision unit administrators; and 16 staff members).
- The participants provided the following input:
  - o Four respondents (9.8 per cent) felt aspects of the policy required clarification.
  - o Ten respondents (23.8 per cent) wanted additional elements to be considered.
  - Nine respondents (21.4 per cent) had concerns with elements of the policy.

- Some of the concerns raised by participants involved requests for stronger language regarding the role of parents to support their children's education, of schools to encourage parental and community involvement, of school councils to communicate with parents, and of the District to engage parents and support school councils. There were also calls for measurement and accountability expectations to be included. The Administration believes the current wording in the draft policy is appropriate to convey the intent of the policy.
- There were several requests to identify the role principals play in promoting parent involvement and to make reference to the school community in order to include all stakeholders. The draft policy has been updated to reflect these suggested changes.
- Some concerns were expressed regarding the role played by businesses in schools; these concerns are addressed by JAA.BP Educational Partnerships and Sponsorships.

### **CONSIDERATIONS & ANALYSIS**

The proposed revisions to this policy strengthen the role of school councils and incorporate the stakeholder feedback gathered during the policy review process. Attached for reference are JAA.BP Educational Partnerships and Sponsorships and JAC.BP Funding and Endorsement Requests from External Organizations.

# **NEXT STEPS**

If JA.BP Parent and Community Involvement is approved by the Board of Trustees, the Administration will post the revised policy on the district website.
