Randy Coombes and Rosa Tarulli, Custodian Team, Lee Ridge School

With over 40 years of experience between them, Randy and Rosa always approach their work at Lee Ridge School with unwavering dedication, enthusiasm and a positive attitude. Their high standards for cleanliness and attention to detail create a welcoming, comfortable and organized learning environment that is noticed by everyone who walks through the doors, including the Occupational Health and Safety auditor who commended the school for its spotlessness and the amazing care given to the building. On annual staff and student satisfaction surveys, school cleanliness is always rated very highly. Neither Randy nor Rosa see limitations in their role as custodians and are always helpful and motivated, taking the time each day to connect and interact with the students, staff and parents.
