Introduction

The purpose of this report is to provide information with respect to the district's two Alberta Initiative for School Improvement (AISI) projects: full day kindergarten in high needs schools and the Supporting Teaching and Learning project.

Alberta Initiative for School Improvement is a three year, targeted government grant to support specific projects that show potential for improvement of student learning. Edmonton Public Schools was involved in the first cycle of AISI (2000 to 2003) and is currently in year two of a second, three-year cycle (2003 to 2006). Projects are approved and funded for one cycle with the expectation that after three years districts will incorporate successful projects through regular funding mechanisms.

Full Day Kindergarten in High Needs Schools

The goals for full day kindergarten for high needs students are:

- to develop and improve early literacy skills, and
- to develop positive attitudes toward learning.

These goals are measured through Marie Clay's Observation of Early Literacy Achievement. The Marie Clay Observation of Early Literacy Achievement examines six early literacy tasks: concepts about print, hearing and decoding sounds in words, letter identification, reading, word test and writing vocabulary.

Full-day kindergarten projects are being implemented in the following high needs schools: Abbott, Belvedere, Delton, Eastwood, Evansdale, Glendale, Inglewood, John A. McDougall, McCauley, North Edmonton, Norwood, Parkdale, Prince Charles, R.J. Scott, Rundle, Sherwood, Sifton and Spruce Avenue. Each of these full-day kindergartens offers literacy based programming and teachers are trained in Balanced Literacy or Meaningfully Applied Phonics (MAP) teaching strategies. Results of Marie Clay's assessment tool are reported Appendix I and indicate a significant improvement in early literacy skills.

Supporting Teaching and Learning

The goals for Supporting Teaching and Learning are:

- to improve achievement of all students, and
- to improve course retention, high school completion and graduation rates.

These goals are measured by the Highest Level of Achievement Tests (HLAT), Provincial Achievement Tests, diploma exam results, course completion rates and high school graduations rates.

The Supporting Teaching and Learning initiative has been implemented in all district schools and central services decision units. It is based on eight expectations for schools and five expectations for central services. Principals, lead teachers and central services leadership staff attend monthly professional development sessions to assist them with this initiative. In addition, principals receive professional development on effective coaching and instructional leadership. The principal, with the support of the school's instructional leadership team, guides the implementation of the eight expectations at the school level. Leadership staff in each central services decision unit follow a similar process related to the five expectations for central services.

Student Achievement Services provides district professional development sessions, coaching support to schools and central decision units.

Consulting Services provides a series of AISI Best Practices Modules based on the needs identified by schools. Each of the modules includes a presentation with built in coaching and teacher collaboration opportunities. Consulting Services also offers the opportunity for schools to contract for targeted ongoing professional development services customized to meet the specific needs of the school.

Funding AISI Projects

AISI funds are tightly targeted by Alberta Education and must be spent on projects that are both sustainable and lead to continuous improvement. Each school receives an AISI allocation based on enrollment. Schools spend these funds in the following areas:

- attending monthly professional development sessions
- participating in AISI Best Practices Modules offered through Consulting Services
- providing time for teacher collaboration sessions at the school site.

Principals are required to indicate the expenditure of AISI dollars as part of the school plan, (Sample school plans are included in Appendix II.) Principals reported on the success of the initiative at the results review in the fall of 2004.

Full-Day Kindergarten Project 2003- 2004 Results

* Percentage of students reaching the age appropriate stanine or better in each of the categories.

Using Marie Clay's Observation Survey, data was collected from all full day kindergarten children by district reading specialists. A pretest was administered in October of the 2003-2004 school year and a post test in June. This test is appropriate for assessing emergent readers' reading skills. The test is administered individually.
