## INFORMATION

The Alexander Rutherford Scholarships recognize and reward exceptional performance at the high school level and encourage students to continue their studies. Recipients must be Alberta residents who have completed high school, and have enrolled in a post-secondary program. The scholarship is based on scholastic performance in grades 10,11 , and 12 with $\$ 400, \$ 800$, and $\$ 1300$ awarded respectively. Students who achieve an average of 80 per cent or higher in five specified subjects receive scholarships (Appendix I).

The dollar values listed above represent a change that took effect as of April 1, 1999. These new values allow students to receive a total of $\$ 2500$ if they qualify for all three high school grades. The previous maximum value was $\$ 1500$.

Table 1 provides a comparison of the number of district students who have qualified for the scholarships for the past six years. A total of 1049 district students received Alexander Rutherford Scholarships in 2000. This is an increase of 42 students from 1999, and represents the highest number of district graduates ever receiving Rutherford Scholarships.

## Grade 10

Average of $80 \%$ or higher in 5 subjects:

- English 10, 13, or Français 10
- Two of the following:
- Pure Mathematics 10 or Applied Mathematics 10 (The New Math)
- Science 10
- Social Studies 10
- A language other than the one used above at the grade 10 level
- Any two other subjects at the grade 10 level including those listed above and courses created by combining any three introductory level C.T.S. Modules.


## Grade 11

Average of $80 \%$ or higher in 5 subjects:

- English 20, 23, Français 20
- Two of the following:
- Pure Mathematics 20 or Applied Mathematics 20 (The New Math)
- Science 20
- Biology 20
- Chemistry 20
- Physics 20
- Social Studies 20
- A language other than the one used above at the grade 11 level
- Any two other subjects at the grade 11 level including those listed above and courses created by combining any three intermediate level C.T.S. Modules.


## Grade 12

Average of $80 \%$ or higher in 5 subjects

- English 30, or Français 30
- Four of the following:
- Pure Mathematics 30 (The New Math)
- Applied Mathematics 30
- Mathematics 31
- Science 30
- Biology 30
- Chemistry 30
- Physics 30
- Social Studies 30
- A language other than the one used above at the grade 12 level.
