Trustee Hansen noted that he had attended the Duke of Edinburgh's Award *Young Canadians Challenge* Bronze Ceremony on Friday, February 16, 2001 at the Centre for Education. Thirty-seven district students mostly under the tutelage of Shaune Haines, completed a number of challenging requirements over an extended period of time, involving the four sections of community service, skill development, physical fitness and expeditions to earn the bronze level of this prestigious honour. He noted that a majority of the students are Aboriginal and of the students originally enrolled in this program, 100 per cent are still in school.
