ISSUE

The following information was requested: What internal advisory committees are active and in place to advance the work of diverse learners within the District? Do any of these committees have external representatives?

BACKGROUND

Advisory committees are organized for specific feedback to the District when information is required. In some cases these committees include representation from internal staff groups and external stakeholders. An example would be the Multicultural Task Force meetings.

There are also advisory groups that include staff members and external members. In addition, there are external advisory committees that district staff facilitates.

- REACH Edmonton, Schools as Hubs project has an external committee with district representation that meets regularly.
- Joint Stakeholder Committee on Children and Poverty, includes cross ministry representatives, as well as Alberta Teachers' Association and district representation.
- Children and Youth with Complex Needs (CYCN)
