2. <u>Gauss Math Contest Winners</u>

On June 7, 2001 Trustee Carol Anne Dean had the privilege of being one of the Master of Ceremonies for the Gauss Math Contest Winners. 62 of the top math students in Grade 7 and 8 in Edmonton were honoured at the Centre for Education. They were among 2,054 students from 46 public, Catholic and Francophone schools who participated in the Gauss Mathematics Competition. The Gauss contest is an hour-long exam which tests superior mathematical ability. This competition was founded by the University of Waterloo and has been administered annually across Canada.

Of the 62 math students who were honoured, 56 were from Edmonton Public Schools. I am also very pleased to announce that we had four district students who achieved a perfect score of 150. They are grade seven students--John Maidens from Kenliworth and Brian Yu from Grandview Heights and Grade 8 students – Alexander Chan and Matthew Michalchuk both from John D. Bracco.
