## **Library Services**

The board recognizes that school learning resource centres support the curricular needs of students, enhance student achievement and literacy development, and inculcate early habits of lifelong learning. To these ends, the board encourages the utilization and ongoing development of school learning resource centres in making available a wide variety of learning resources for student research and enjoyment.

To the extent that qualified personnel are available possible, provision will should be made for teacher-librarians for all-elementary, elementary junior high schools, and junior high schools with approved libraries learning resource centres.

A library service branch will be established to:

- a. assist in the ordering of basic book collections for new schools;
- b. classify, catalogue and process these books prior to opening of the schools;
- c. assist, to the extent time is available, the processing of the initial book collections of newly established libraries in existing schools.

The board recognizes that the provision of clerical assistance in operating school libraries, is essential if teacher librarians are to be free to carry out their professional duties.
