INFORMATION

In June 2001 the district approved a review of its French language instruction. The goal of the review was to gain an understanding of the present state of the French Immersion (FIM) and French Second Language (FSL) programming and the challenges facing these programs. The information would serve to design and implement a strategy, which will:

- a) strengthen program success and
- b) increase student enrolment in both FIM and FSL programs.

At meetings throughout 2000-2001, FIM principals clearly indicated a need for central leadership in helping to reverse a downward trend in both FSL and FIM enrolments. The decline in students studying French is province wide, and in Edmonton Public Schools' numbers have dropped over 30 per cent in the past decade. The decline does not seem to be related to the existence of other language programs. During this time principals, teachers, parents and community organizations expressed concern about the large range of proficiency among students completing a French program at the grade 9 or 12 level. The Office of the Commissioner of Official Languages also passed on concerns about the steep decline in French enrolments in the district, a district that at one time was a model for French language programming throughout the nation.

The district recognizes that French is not only one of the International languages, but an official language of Canada, one that is needed if one is to take full advantage of Canadian citizenship. To this end the district struck a steering committee composed of parents, principals, teachers, representing both FIM and FSL schools, and central services staff. The services of Evaluation Plus Inc. were retained to help guide the review, collection, and interpretation of data collected. Evaluation Plus Inc. brought to the project four of the most experienced people in Alberta in the area of French language education, Dr. Wally Lazaruk, Edmond Levasseur, Marcel Lavallée and Alana LaPerle. The district has thus entered into one of the most aggressive language renewal projects in Alberta's history.

The steering committee approved a set of recommendations that resulted from the review's findings. (Appendix I: Un nouveau jour! Renewal of French Language Programs in Edmonton Public Schools) Implementation of the recommendations will be made possible by an allocation of \$400,000 per year for three years. Application for additional support for the project has been made to both provincial and federal departments, and is being seriously considered, as the results of the project will be of benefit to French language education from coast to coast. Peace River School Division has already purchased some components resulting from the project to support French Immersion. In addition an influential French Language Advisory Group has been formed to help the district establish partnerships to enhance the opportunities for teachers and students (Appendix III).

Details of the project plan, as recommended by the steering committee and reviewed by Superintendent's Council and principal vertical groups, are found in Appendix II. The district will use document analysis, questionnaires and interviews on an annual basis to determine whether the expected results are being achieved. The key results will be increased student enrolment and distinguished student results, which will be linked to national and international standards. Each goal and strategy will include performance indicators and measures.

Edmonton Public Schools will achieve the goal of having the most effective French language program in the nation and will prove that here in the Canadian west, students can become proficient users of the French language.
