C. Communications from the Board Chairman

The following is a text of the chairman's communications:

Good evening. I wanted to take this opportunity to acknowledge the **Education Services Settlement Act** legislation introduced by the provincial government.

I also want to acknowledge the significant effect that this proposed legislation has had, and will have, on our teachers' morale.

It was always our board's preference to reach a negotiated settlement. Binding arbitration is clearly a less than ideal resolution to any labour dispute.

There is still a window of opportunity between now and the start of the arbitration process for our board and the ATA to reach a negotiated settlement. We would welcome the opportunity to work towards this goal.

We appreciate that working conditions are an ongoing concern. Despite the fact that working conditions will not be included in the arbitration process, we recognize that concerns about these issues must continue to be addressed.

For years, the board's priority has been to advocate for public education to government. From meetings with MLAs to participating in joint advocacy initiatives with the other urban boards, my fellow trustees and I have repeatedly communicated to the government that the funding of public education is a serious issue in this province.

We have one of the best education systems in the world and if it is to remain that way, it needs to be funded adequately and appropriately.

We are pleased to know that the provincial government plans to conduct an examination of Alberta's education system. It is our hope that this examination will begin to address the serious and complex challenges that we currently face in public education.

In closing, I believe it is important to acknowledge that all parties – the board, the government and the teachers – all of us – have been motivated by what we believe to be in the best interest of students.

We must ensure that in the days and weeks to come that we continue to keep students and their learning our first priority. Thank you.
