C. <u>Communications from the Board Chair</u>

The Board Chair advised that, this past Fall, 30 district schools participated in the country wide Student Vote program – a non-partisan parallel federal election program for developing habits of citizenship within young Canadians. Over 3,000 schools and 500,000 students across the county studied the democratic process, local candidates, party platforms and national issues before voting on the official candidates in their schools' ridings. Students themselves took on the roles of returning officers, poll clerks and scrutineers on Student Vote Day at their schools. Letters are being sent with Certificates of Recognition for the 30 district teachers who coordinated the project and submitted Student Vote results from their school.

I. Other Trustee Reports

<u>Trustee Fleming</u> noted that Parkallen School Principal Vince Friesen had advised that the Parkallen community had been chosen to be the host community in Edmonton for the *Local Motion Project* which is a demonstration project to encourage eco-friendly modes transportation. The project looks at ways to transform a neighbourhood into a place where a variety of eco-mobility elements are brought together in a functioning system. The project will involve school programs, community challenges, public transit initiatives, community bikes and a bike-loan program, as well as physical changes to the community such as bike lanes. The process will be documented through film and the results will be reported to a World Congress called Local Governments for Sustainability. The Partners for this project are the City of Edmonton, Parkallen Community, Transport Canada, the Global Alliance for Eco-Mobility and Parkallen School.

<u>Trustee Ripley</u> reported that she brought greetings and presented a commemorative plaque on behalf of the Board at the 100th Anniversary Celebration of Norwood School on Saturday. She commended the organizing committee for their efforts. The Minister of Education, MLA Peter Goldring, Mayor Mandel, City Councillors Tony Caterina and Ed Gibbons, the Superintendent, and past principals of the school Dr. Heather Raymond and Sandra Woitas were also in attendance.

<u>Trustee Ripley</u> reported that she had attended the ASBA expanded policy committee meeting yesterday. The committee has been working on streamlining and condensing the ASBA Policy Handbook. A section of the Handbook will be introduced at the Zone 23 meeting on Friday.

<u>Trustee Esslinger</u> reported that, on February 11, 2009, she and Trustee Huff participated in the provincial celebration Winter Walk Day 2009 at Westglen School. The Minister of Tourism, Parks and Recreation Cindy Ady was also in attendance.

<u>Trustee Esslinger</u> reported that, also on February 11, 2009, she and Trustees Huff and Ripley, had lunch with the Police Chief and many district students as part of the Day with the Edmonton Police Service Chief Michael Boyd.

<u>Trustee Esslinger</u> reported that, on February 11, 2009, she attended the Open House for the New Languages Centre at Woodcroft School.

<u>Trustee Esslinger</u> reported that she had attended a cheque presentation, on behalf of the district, to the Boyle Street Co-op. The proceeds were the results of the *Heart2Art Campaign* (the campaign to raise awareness about homelessness) which many district students participated in. The Co-op was able to purchase a house they called "Valentine" to represent the work done by students throughout the city.

<u>Trustee Fleming</u>, reported that in his capacity as President of the Public School Boards Association of Alberta, he had recently signed a letter to be sent to the Reeve of the Municipal District of Opportunity located in northern Alberta and a copy sent to the Minister of Education, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Minister of Labour and Employment. The letter is the result of a directive that the Reeve has put out to all employees of the Municipal District of Opportunity that they must choose if they wish to either remain an employee of the Municipal District or serve on the Northland School Board.
