- 1. The chairman advised that yesterday, March 21st, was the International Day for the Elimination of Discrimination. The Northern Alberta Alliance on Race Relations (N.A.A.R.R) offered a program of activities for students, staff and the general public to commemorate this important day.
- 2. The chairman advised that the Board of Trustees will pay tribute to staff members who have provided twenty-five and thirty years of service to Edmonton Public Schools tomorrow evening. The Long Service Recognition ceremony provides the board with an opportunity to thank staff members for their many years of dedication and service to our district, our schools and our students.

This year the board of trustees is proud to honour:

- 201 staff members for 25 years of service and
- 141 staff members who have achieved 30 years of service

The presentation ceremony will be held in the Eva O. Howard Theatre, Victoria School, with a reception to follow in the Centre for Education Atrium.

The chairman announced that he had received a letter from the Minister of Education today in which the Minister states that \$12.8 million dollars of one-time funding will be granted to school districts for textbooks and other classroom resources. Edmonton Public Schools will receive \$1.83 million dollars.

The funds come to us with some flexibility, although Alberta Education has yet to communicate further details. We are able to allocate these funds to schools. Schools may purchase resources from the Learning Resources Centre or other distributors and they may choose to provide professional development opportunities for the introduction and implementation of new curriculum, such as the social studies curriculum.

The administration will be folding this new money into the 2005-2006 planning allocations to schools. This money will provide support to help our staff implement new curriculum and to ensure greater availability of current resources in all of our schools.
