



Summary of Board Meeting #14 Held Tuesday, May 8, 2012

A. O Canada: (2:00 p.m.) – District O Canada Video

B. Roll Call: All Trustees were present.

C. Communications from the Board Chair

- The Board Chair advised that May 17th is *International Day Against Homophobia*. Inspired by all world theme-days, the day set aside to fight homophobia needs to be appropriated by all of those actively involved in civil society: gay and lesbian community organizations, those organizations focusing on other types of sexual diversity, unions, employers, private businesses, governments, public administration, professional associations, and all individuals seeking equality.
- The Board Chair advised that, on Saturday, he attended the Chinese Bridge Competition at the Confucius Institute in Edmonton at Woodcroft School.
- The Board Chair advised that, yesterday, May 7, 2012, he attended the Mental Health Week Kickoff held at Dan Knott School. Ministers Thomas Lukaszuk and Fred Horne were also in attendance.
- The Board Chair congratulated Mr. Jeff Johnson on his appointment as the new Minister of Education.

D. Communications from the Superintendent of Schools

- The Superintendent advised the Board of the following actions taken by students and school staff aligned to the District Priority of deepening students, understanding of equity and empathy as key citizenship traits:
 - Students and staff hosted special events celebrating "Leaders in a Global Village" at Bannerman School. For one of their projects, students are making baby blankets and donating them to WINGS of Providence a women's shelter.
 - Amiskwaciy Academy students built and donated 12 Houses for Hounds to the Second Chance Animal Society. The project was possible through a Lowe's Toolbox for Education grant.

The Superintendent informed the Board that the District will be hosting two groups of visitors from Singapore on May 14 and 15th. They will be visiting schools and are interesting in how we develop citizenship among students and how we develop safe and caring attitudes and behaviours in our schools.
