#### Background - Recommendation 2

Due to recent economic challenges, the Government of Alberta has delayed the submission date for the District's 2009-2010 Expenditure Budget to November 30, 2009. The recommended process and timeline will merge the 2008-2009 Results Review, the 2008-2009 Financial Audit Review and the 2009-2010 Financial Specifications Process so that Trustees can consider a recommendation to approve the 2009-2010 Expenditure Budget on November 24, 2009.

The recommended process and timeline is outlined in APPENDIX I. Every effort has been made to ensure Trustees are provided relevant programming and financial information in a timely manner and that opportunities to ask questions or express concerns are available before the 2009-2010 Expenditure Budget recommendation goes before public board on November 24, 2009. It is also important to note that the recommended process adheres to the requirements for reviewing previous year's results as specified in Board policies and regulations (APPENDIX II).

A key element of the recommended process is the Trustee subcommittee results reviews. Central reviews are scheduled on November 2, 2009 and will be held at the Centre for Education. School reviews will be held between November 3<sup>rd</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> at specified school locations. APPENDIX III identifies the location and groupings for Trustee Subcommittee reviews. The intent of the subcommittee meetings is to facilitate direct discussion between Trustees, principals and central decision unit managers about their 2008-2009 results and the implications these results will have on their 2009-2010 operational plans. As in previous years, the school decision units with 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> year principals will be reviewed by Assistant Superintendents.

To assist the subcommittee discussions Trustees and Assistant Superintendents will be provided copies of the 2008-2009 Results Review documents and a summary document of the updated 2009-2010 operational plan for each decision unit that they review. The updated plans will reflect the student enrolment as of September 30, 2009, a summary of current operational initiatives and the distribution of resources for the current year (as displayed in the 2009-2010 Financial Specifications).

#### Background – Recommendation 3

On August 20, 2009, Assistant Superintendent Barrett met with Mr. Dick Chamey, representing the Coalition on Physical Punishment of Children and Youth. Mr. Chamey provided information on the organization's Joint Statement on Physical Punishment of Children and Youth (APPENDIX IV) and requested that the District provide a letter endorsing the Joint Statement on Physical Punishment of Children and Youth.

The organization will be making a submission to the Minister of Education requesting that the revisions to the *School Act* include a formal statement opposing the use of corporal punishment in school systems. Should the Board wish to support this request our District would be added to other educational endorsements as part of their submission.

The Administration has reviewed the materials and believes they are aligned with District policy and practice.

#### Background – Recommendation 4

In accordance with Administrative Regulation GBA.AR – Designation, Appointment and Assignment to Leadership Positions (APPENDIX V) exempt management staff who hold a teacher contract are designated for a three-year term.

#### REQUIREMENTS

#### Requirements for the Results Review and Three-Year Planning Process

- Trustees, staff, parents, students, and the community will be satisfied with their opportunity to review the results of all schools and central departments, to be involved in the three-year planning process, and to obtain additional information as required.
- The Board will approve the District three-year plan, annual amendments, and the annual
  operating budget and will be informed of district level results achieved.
- The District three-year education plan and budget are approved by the Board preceding implementation.
- By November 17 of each school year, the Board will be informed of the district's previous year's achievement results.
- Plans are developed and results reported in accordance with the District mission and priorities which are in alignment with the provincial requirements.
- Processes implemented for the reporting and review of results, and the development, review, approval, and amendment of plans and budgets are accepted and supported by the Board, staff, parents, and the community.
- The format for reporting results and three-year plans is consistent among schools and among decision units.
- The authority to propose and amend plans, and to expend funds is in accordance with responsibility for results.
- The budget accurately reflects the anticipated costs of meeting the identified educational requirements of students, is developed in accordance with government requirements and generally accepted accounting procedures, and includes specific identification of surpluses and deficits, amortized purchases, school generated funds, and internal and external revenues.
- The basis for the allocation of resources is equitable and is so perceived.
- Trustees are provided with the opportunity to identify initiatives to be included in school or central department planning.

### Executive summary

#### Background

The Joint Statement on Physical Punishment of Children and Youth was developed by a national partnership of organizations concerned with the well-being of children and their families. It has been formally endorsed by many Canadian organizations and individuals involved in a broad range of issues related to children and youth.

#### Purpose and audience

Based on extensive research evidence, the statement provides an overview of the developmental outcomes associated with the use of physical punishment on children and youth. Scenarios depicting disciplinary situations ground the document in the realities well known to parents and caregivers. The statement will also be of interest to professionals, policy and program planners, members of the public, and children and youth themselves. Resources are identified for those interested in learning more about effective discipline and parenting.

#### Highlights of findings

The research evidence now available permits us to move beyond the debate about whether physical punishment is harmful to children and youth or is even effective as discipline.

- There is no clear evidence of any benefit from the use of physical punishment on children.
- There is strong evidence that physical punishment places children at risk for physical injury, poorer mental health, impaired relationships with parents, weaker internalization of moral values, antisocial behaviour, poorer adult adjustment and tolerance of violence in adulthood.
- Few parents believe that physical punishment is effective, most believe it is unnecessary and harmful, and a majority think the most common outcome is parental guilt or regret.
- Parents are more likely to use physical punishment if they approve of it, experienced it themselves as children, feel anger in response to their children's behaviour, are subject to depression, or are burdened by particular forms of stress.

#### Conclusion and implications

On the basis of the clear and compelling evidence—that the physical punishment of children and youth plays no useful role in their upbringing and poses only risks to their development—parents should be strongly encouraged to develop alternative and positive approaches to discipline. The implications of this evidence and this goal are examined in relation to Canadian law, human rights and actions taken by other countries.

#### Recommendations

Recommendations for action in Canada include: (1) delivery of public awareness messages to inform all Canadians that physical punishment is harmful to children's development and is ineffective as discipline; (2) development of universal parenting education; and (3) provision of the same protection of children from physical assault as is given to Canadian adults and to children in a growing number of countries. Responsibility for action lies within the jurisdiction of national, provincial and territorial and local levels of government, the mandates of organizations, and the expertise of professionals who serve children and youth. The statement as a whole may be considered an urge to action by parents and caregivers—within and beyond their families.

#### 1. DEFINITIONS

- a. Designation or designated refers to a leadership position given to an individual who holds a teacher contract.
- b. Appointment or appointed refers to a leadership position given to an individual who does not hold a teacher contract.
- c. Assignment or assigned refers to the location or area of responsibility of those designated or appointed to leadership positions.

#### 2. DESIGNATIONS

- a. Principals are designated by the Board of Trustees for a two-year term prior to designation by the Board of Trustees for an indefinite term and are assigned by the Superintendent of Schools.
- b. Assistant Principals designated by the Board of Trustees prior to 1996-1997 continue to hold the designation of Assistant Principal until the designation is terminated.
- c. Exempt management staff who hold a teacher contract and are designated as Assistant Superintendent, Managing Director, or Director are designated for a three-year term.
- d. Exempt management staff who hold a teacher contract and are designated as Supervisor are designated for a one-year term.
- e. All designations not included in 2. a., b., c., or d. above are for a one-year term.

#### 3. APPOINTMENTS

Exempt management staff who do not hold a teacher contract are appointed for an indefinite term.
