## C. <u>Communications from the Board Chairman</u>

- 1. The chairman advised that the Edmonton Chamber of Commerce recently presented a 2005 Alberta Centennial Business Award to Edmonton Public Schools. The award recognizes the district's 100 years of service and commitment to the City of Edmonton and the Province of Alberta and contributions to the pioneering spirit, charitable character and continued prosperity of our community.
- 2. The chairman advised that October 2<sup>nd</sup> is Custodial Workers Recognition Day. The district appreciates and values the members of CUPE Local 474, our custodial staff, whose work helps create clean, safe environments that support teaching and learning every day.
