## **INFORMATION**

In May 1999, a total of 164 district students from four high schools (J. Percy Page, Jasper Place, M. E. LaZerte, and Strathcona) wrote 233 Advanced Placement (AP) Examinations. This is a decrease of 48 students and 78 examinations from 1998. This decrease is likely due to the fact that two district schools, Queen Elizabeth and Victoria, did not administer Advanced Placement examinations in the 1998-99 school year. Tables 1, 2, and 3 provide district, Canadian, and global results for May 1999.

Caution must be used in making comparisons for all courses except Chemistry, English Literature and Composition, and Mathematics since the number of district students participating in the exams is fifteen or less.

District averages were higher than Canadian averages for Biology, French and Mathematics, but lower for the remaining six courses. District averages were higher than world averages for all courses except English Literature and Composition, European History, and Computer Science.

The district had a higher percentage of students achieve a score of 3, 4, or 5 than the world for six of the nine courses, but not for English Literature and Composition, European History, or Computer Science.

When comparing 1999 district results to the previous year, the district average is higher for Chemistry and French, but lower for Biology, English Literature and Composition, European History, and German. Appendix I provides district results for 1996 to 1999.

Table 4 provides Advanced Placement examination results for district schools.
